PURPOSE

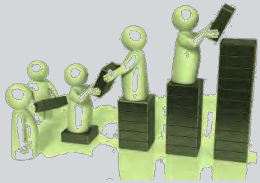
- The purpose of the Interim Supply Chain Management (SCM) Council is to professionalise SCM in the country.
- The Interim SCM Council will establish SCM as a discipline within the South African educational system; define a national set of SCM norms and standards; develop a framework for career pathing that allows for progression, articulation, portability, transferability and recognition; and develop a framework for ethical professional conduct.



OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Interim SCM Council are, inter alia:

- To coordinate the various SCM stakeholders in the country (professional organisations, academia, business and government);
- To establish SCM as a discipline within the educational system;
- To develop and regulate a set of national norms and standards for SCM;
- To develop a framework for career pathing and progression in the field of SCM;
- To provide a framework for ethical professional conduct;
- To endorse SCM qualifications;

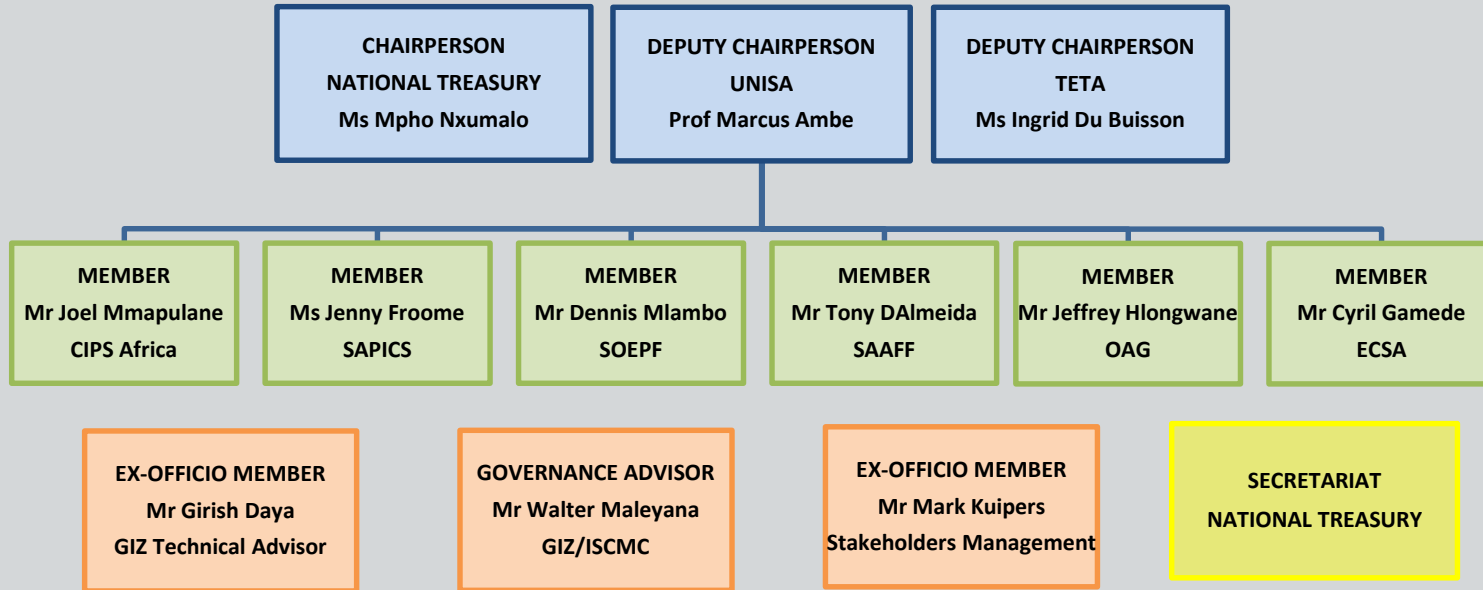


OBJECTIVES CONTINUE.....

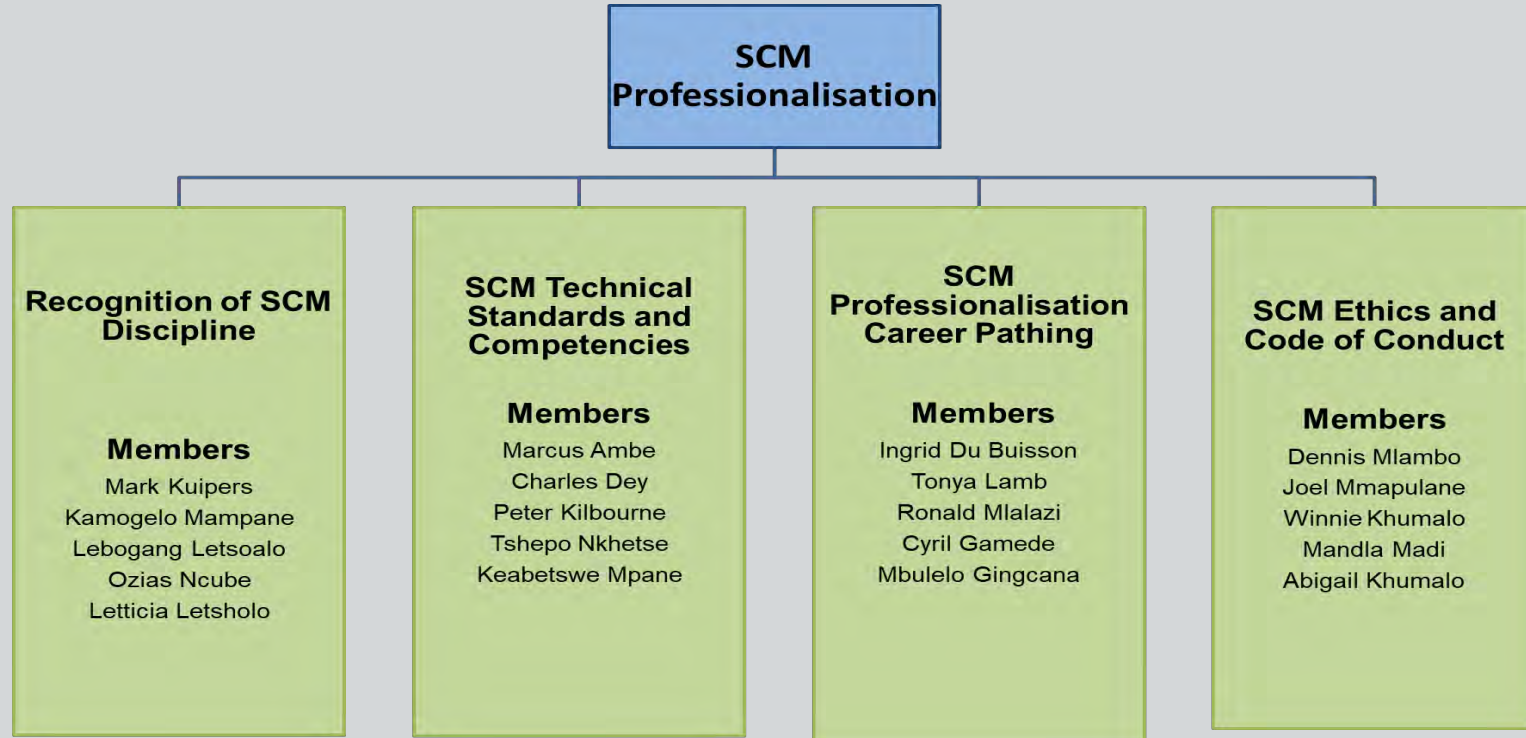
- To serve as advisory support to the OCPO, Minister of Finance, the Quality Council for Trades and Occupations (QCTO), and the Council of Higher Education (CHE) on matters relating to the SCM profession;
- To conduct research to determine key trends and developments on competencies, norms and standards;
- To provide thought leadership and guidance on SCM good practice;
- To advocate for SCM to be recognised as a profession;
- To advocate for ethical professional conduct; and
- To advocate for ethical SCM practices.

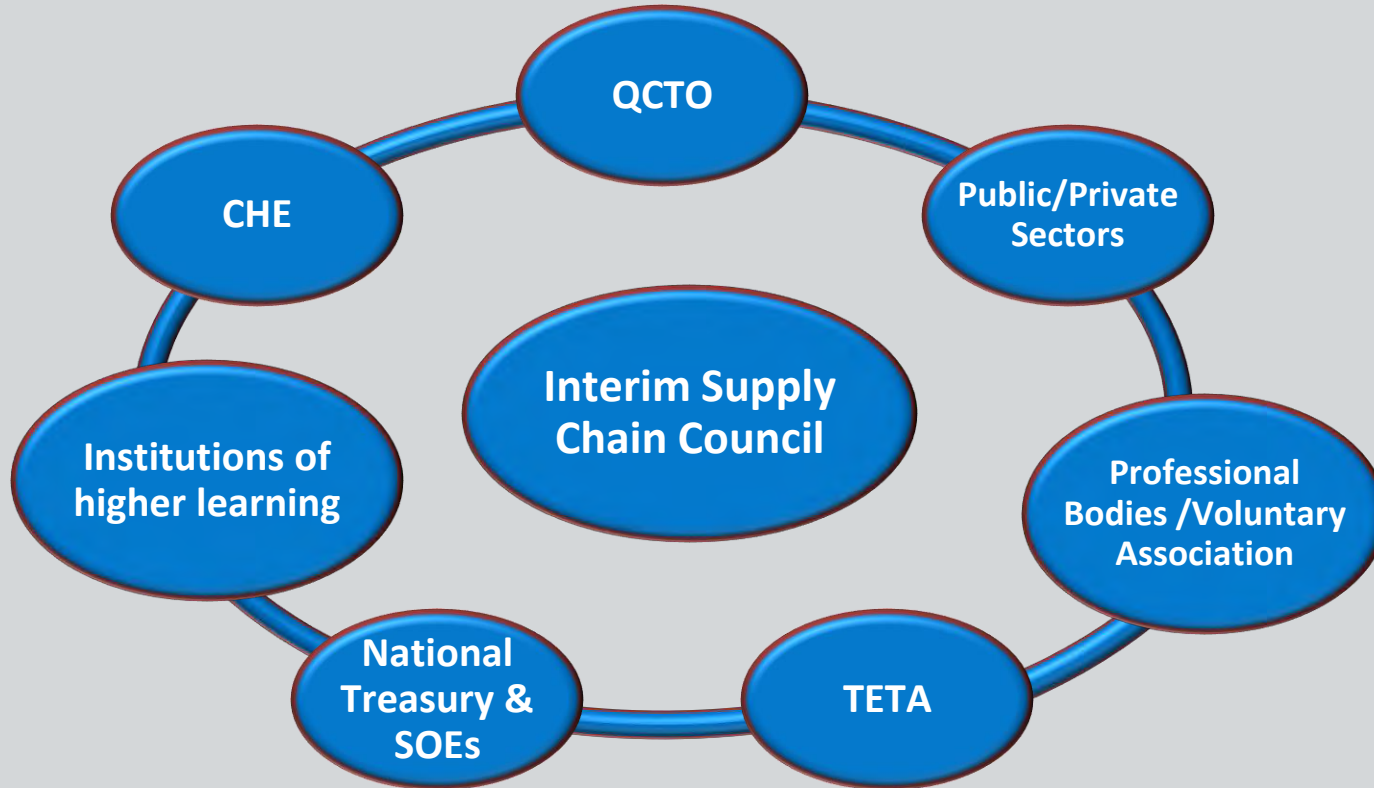

PROGRESS TO DATE

- On 01 February 2018 the Director-General of National Treasury approved the Terms of Reference and the establishment of the Interim SCM Council.
- Appointment of a full-time Governance Advisor, funded by GIZ *to support the ISCMC on its development*;
- Successfully held four quarterly sittings;
- Adopted a programme of action for 2019;
- Developed draft generic code of conduct *which is* to be approved by the 5th sitting; and
- Developed draft professionalisation framework *which is* to be adopted by the 5th sitting;

PROGRESS TO DATE CONTINUE.....

- Advertised a tender to undertake a benchmarking study;
- Advertised a tender for the drafting of a business plan;
- Workshop with South African Board of Peoples Practice (SABPP) on Professionalisation, technical standard and competencies;
- Branding and development of logo is in progress;
- Terms of references for the Council and Committees are developed;
- The Interim SCM Council has engaged the CHE, SAQA and Department of Higher Education and Training (DHET) as part of its stakeholder engagement and advocacy.
